BART PLAZA DESIGN – Community Involvement




- City selected Related/Mission Housing as development team - June 2016.
- BART participated in City-led community meetings to get feedback about plaza improvements - Spring 2017.
- BART collaborated with development team plaza design presentations to community -2018-2019.
- Plaza and Upper Yard project received joint State funding- Summer 2020.
- BART conducted extensive community outreach regarding the station modernization plan




BART PLAZA DESIGN UPDATE

BART PLAZA DESIGN UPDATE - Access & Circulation

- Better access to BART station, passenger drop off area & Muni stops
- Direct and accessible path from passenger drop off area
- ADA accessible path from plaza to address slope along Geneva Ave
- Looped BART passenger drop off area via San Jose Ave only

BART PLAZA DESIGN UPDATE - Public Open Space


A pedestrian-friendly, multi-use plaza to foster a sense of community

- Open space near BART Station available for community activities to activate the space.
- Patio space next to BPUY nearly
 3 times larger than original design—
 possible use by BPUY tenants
- Seating areas for BART & Muni riders,
 BPUY tenants and general public

BART PLAZA DESIGN UPDATE – Quality of Life Enhancements

- Tiered plaza design provides clear views in all directions
- New lighting and security cameras in plaza & along paths, station perimeter
- New Real Time Display to show train arrival times
- Better integrated plaza with several points of connections
- Incorporates ADA accessible paths
- New trees throughout plaza





Next Steps

Further refinement of plaza design elements

- Select plant species in plaza area
- Finalize design; develop construction drawings

BART Board Approval

Early 2021

City, BART and development team to finalize construction logistics

- Determine temporary locations for passenger drop offs
- Determine temporary pedestrian connections to station and bus stops

Construction

- Commence 18 months after BPUY project starts
- Construction duration 6-8 months
- Plaza and BPUY to open at the same

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


BALBOA PARK UPPER YARD HOUSING PROJECT

Balboa Park Upper Yard Housing Project Overview



Number of Units: 131 units



- One, two, and three-bedrooms homes
- Goal of 40% of units for existing neighborhood residents.
- Units set aside as permanent supportive housing for formerly homeless.


Additional Spaces:

- 6,000 sf child development center.
- 2,400 sf non-profit office space.
- 3,000 sf retail.
- Community room, courtyard, bike parking





Working in conjunction with the Balboa Reservoir



- Coordinating with MTA and other city agencies to improve pedestrian connections to BART and MUNI along Ocean Avenue, as well as working with MTA to address key transit issues along Ocean Avenue and Frida Kahlo Way.
- The project invests upwards of \$10 million dollars in Transportation Sustainability Fees (TSF) to the City of San Francisco for transit and infrastructure improvements.
- Built-in incentives to encourage new residents to walk, bike, and ride transit.
